El curso está diseñado para administradores de sistemas, analistas y desarrolladores que desean aprender a implementar y gestionar servicios de directorio LDAP en entornos de TI

Pre requisito

El curso LDAP and Directory Services: Essentials recomienda los siguientes prerrequisitos:

1. Oracle WebLogic Server 11g: Administration Essentials Ed 2
2. UNIX and Linux Essentials Ed 1
3. Conocimiento básico de comandos de usuario de Unix/Linux
